Storrowton Village presents a self-guided tour of a group of historical schoolhouses in the surrounding area. This tour includes the **Nash Hill Schoolhouse**, 117 Nash Hill Road, Williamsburg. Built in 1786 as part of the five-school district, the Nash Hill School was given to the Williamsburg Historical Society in 1971 and restored by dedicated volunteers over a span of fifteen years. It was opened to the public in 1986, two hundred years after its original construction.
