

Minutes of Williamsburg Water/Sewer Commission
December 1, 2010

Members of the Water/Sewer Commission met in regular session on Wednesday, December 1, 2010 @ 7:00 P.M. The Chairman called the meeting to order and upon roll call the following were present: Walter Kellogg-Chairman, William Turner-Vice Chairman, Ken Taylor - Clerk, Howard Sanderson, James Hyslip & Brenda Lessard, Secretary. Public Present- Lincoln Fish & Larry Lashway

1. Timber bids were opened. There were seven bids. The bidders were: Donald & Diane Culver, Hull Forest Products, Lashway Forest Products, Dave Wacker, Chris Brown, Allard Brothers Lumber & Gerry Lashway Lumber. The winning bidder was Lashway Forest Products with a bid of \$20195.00. William Turner made a motion to award the bid work contingent on the quality of past performance in other jobs. The motion was seconded by James Hyslip. All members so voted. William Turner & Lincoln Fish will talk to Mr. Lashway regarding an inspection of the work by the person who will do the harvesting. The bid will be formally voted on at next meeting depending on references.
2. The Board spoke with Mr. Fish about the boundary markings on all the town's watershed property. Mr. Fish stated they would be completed in mid January.
3. Motion made by William Turner to accept the Minutes of 11/17/2010. The motion was seconded by Howard Sanderson. Motion so voted.
4. Motion made by James Hyslip to sign and accept the warrants for December 8, 2010. The motion was seconded by Ken Taylor. The motion was so voted and the warrants were signed.
5. There were two abatements signed for George Cone for an incorrect meter reading and for Andrew Maclachlan for a double bill.
6. Commitments were signed for water & sewer.
7. Walter Kellogg reported that he had called DEP three times about discontinuing the chlorination. He has not received an answer yet.
8. William Turner reported that the beavers are not in the hutch and the trapper cannot trap them yet. The beavers were sleeping on the bank. He will continue to monitor them and when they hutch he will set the trap.
9. James Hyslip reported that the tree near the gate house still needs to be taken down at the reservoir on Unquomonk Road and that the dam is running and everything looks good.
10. Motion made by Ken Taylor to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by William Turner. The motion was so voted.
